

Environmental Declaration

Basic Philosophy

Based on its recognition that the conservation of the natural environment is a critical priority for all humankind, NTC is committed to helping achieve a sustainable society by bringing full employee participation to bear in reducing the environmental impact of its operations.

Policy

NTC strives to achieve harmony with the natural environment by practicing environmental management based on the policies described below. This effort is conceived to reduce the environmental impact of all activities, products, and services related to educating and training technical personnel in the field of nuclear power generation and assessing trainee compliance with the standards that have been established for certification as a nuclear power plant operator:

1. In addition to maintaining an awareness at all times of the environmental effects of NTC's business activities and striving to prevent environmental pollution, all personnel shall work to improve environmental management activities on an ongoing basis.
2. All personnel shall observe environmental laws and regulations as well as other requirements that apply to NTC's business activities.
3. The following environmental effects of NTC's business activities have been identified as environmental management priority themes:
 - a. Contributing to stable plant operation through enhanced operational training
 - b. Reducing power consumption
 - c. Reducing paper consumption
 - d. Reducing water consumption
4. In addition to disseminating this Environmental Declaration within the company so that all employees can strive actively to reduce the environmental impact of the company's operations, NTC shall publicize it outside the company.
5. NTC shall participate actively in local environmental improvement activities.

NTC shall pursue environmental management activities in order to implement the above policies, including by establishing and periodically reviewing associated goals and objectives.
